*You may be eligible for zoning incentives that allow for more lot coverage for additions.*

*You will be eligible for financial incentives, including grants and loans, from the Louisville Historic Preservation Fund.*

*You may become eligible for a State Income Tax Credit for Historic Preservation.*

*You will contribute to your community by preserving your property for future generations.*

*You will help save Louisville's character.*
