WED, April 21, ❖ 7 p.m. ❖ "Newfoundland"

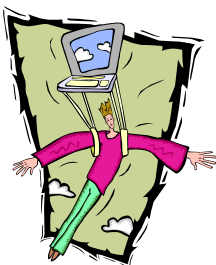
Enjoy some armchair travel as Charlie Anderson presents his slide show of this fascinating land.
